Doctor of Education (EdD) in Curriculum and Instruction
Sample Program of Study (4-Year Plan/12 semesters – Summer Residency)*

Classes taken in fall and spring are offered 4:30 to 7:00 p.m. or later. Summer classes are typically offered in 2-, 4-, or 8-week sessions during the daytime.

Prerequisite EDUC 6570, *Introduction to Educational & Psychological Research*, or a comparable course is REQUIRED. To establish adequate statistics background for the doctoral research core, doctoral students must also pass a basic statistics competency exam. Psychology 2800, *Psychological Statistics*, or a comparable statistics course is excellent preparation for the test.
